General Information

- Passes for tours are allocated on a first come, first served basis. In addition, the East Side Access and 9/11 Memorial tours have early registration requirements. East Side Access, Queens Bored Tunnels Visit (a.m. - time to be confirmed)

- The East Side Access project will connect the Long Island Railroad to Grand Central Terminal. This tour will visit the open cut works and bored tunnels in Queens. Attendees will likely see a tunnel boring machine and a completed section of tunnel. Personal protective equipment (including boots) will be provided.
- A copy of your passport or American Driver's License will be required, by March 7th, for a background security check. Please do not provide this until after your place on the tour is confirmed.
- **This tour is available to conference delegates only. Cost - Delegate: \$30**

New York City Buildings Bus Tour (p.m. - time to be confirmed)

- This bus tour will highlight the history and present life of New York City through its engineering and architecture. Starting at the World Trade Center, the tour will pass the Chrysler Building, United Nations, City Hall, Citicorp and Flatiron buildings, as well as Time Square and Chinatown. It will highlight some great places for you to return to later.
- **Cost - Delegate: \$30 / Guest (one guest per delegate): \$40**

High Line Tour (a.m. and p.m. – times to be confirmed)

- The high line is a recently opened aerial park running up the west side of Manhattan. Originally an early 20th century rail line to get freight from the river piers into the rail system, the park now offers fantastic views of the Hudson River and New York City. The tour will highlight the history, engineering and architecture of the area.
- **Cost - Delegate: \$10 / Guest (one guest per delegate): \$10**

World Trade Center - 9/11 Memorial Visit (10 a.m. and 2 p.m. visits)

- The National September 11 Memorial honors those killed in the terror attacks of September 11, 2001 and February 1993. The Memorial's twin reflecting pools sit within the footprints where the Twin Towers once stood and feature the largest manmade waterfalls in the North America.
- This is not an ICE guided tour but offers a chance to view the Memorial at the same time as fellow attendees. 10:00am and 2:00pm visits are planned. Visitor Passes must be applied for well-ahead of time by each attendee and is dependent upon availability – if you are considering this visit, we recommend you obtain Visitor Passes now.
